What is an emergency?

When is my pet in need of emergency medical attention?

Not sure if it is an emergency? Here are some symptoms that may require immediate care:

- Respiratory distress (laboured breathing, choking)
- Neurological impairment- inability to walk or use a leg
- Potential foreign body ingestion or possible toxic poisoning.
- Severe bodily harm (motor vehicle accident, animal attack, etc.)
- Potential broken bones
- Shock: Blue, white or very pale gums
- Collapse or loss of consciousness, or inability to respond to stimuli
- Dizziness, imbalance, or circling
- Seizures
- Signs of acute severe pain (such as crying out very loudly and excessively)

- Body temperature over 104 or under 99 (normal is typically 100.5-102.5)
- Inability to urinate or defecate
- Enlarged or bloated abdomen, retching, gagging

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
